WHEREAS, the healing properties of the Native American "heartbeat drum has lately been documented by scientific research at Louisiana State University; and



WHEREAS, Jacob Devaney and the Living Folklore has organized this worldwide drum for these last 4 years; now therefore



August 27, 1999 that this council recognizes the work of Jacob Devaney and the Living Folklore and joins people around the world in honoring


